



Severe weather conditions come in many different forms: tornados, hurricanes, lightning, etc. They are very dangerous and can cause serious injury. The following preparedness information, combined with timely severe weather warnings, may save your life. Please prepare yourself so if an emergency does happen you'll be ready to take action.

- Familiarize yourself with your location – know the safe interior rooms/spaces that are free of windows and exposure to the exterior.
- When notified of a Severe Weather Alert, immediately move to that interior safe location. Encourage others to seek shelter also, but do not hesitate to get safe if they delay.
- If possible, close room and hallway doors as you move to a safe location. This will reduce the effects of the wind and protect you from flying debris.
- If you must move to a lower floor, **USE THE STAIRS – DO NOT USE THE ELEVATOR.**
- Remain in shelter until it is safe.

IF YOU'RE IN A VEHICLE OUTDOORS:

Vehicles and outdoor areas are an extremely dangerous place to be during severe weather emergencies. At the first indication of a weather emergency, move quickly and safely to the nearest sturdy building. Tornados, hurricanes, and flash floods move very quickly and sporadically, so don't delay yourself by trying to protect or gather your things. Your safety is top priority – get to a safe location quickly!
